- 5. Entries will be judged by a panel of professionals with experience in writing, newspaper or periodical editing, or related communications field.
- 6. Please submit no more than three samples of a club's bulletin published between April 1 and March
- 31 for consideration by the judges.

When your club becomes involved in this worthwhile program, you are joining hundreds of other clubs across the country in an effort to identify and recognize the youth leaders of the nation.

Local Exchange Club Youth of the Year winners are eligible to compete for the Tennessee District Youth of the Year award. The TN District award carries a scholarship of **at least \$1,000** and the right to compete for the National Exchange Club Youth of the Year award.

The Tennessee District Youth of the Year award will be presented at the TN District convention. To be eligible, the award winner must be present at the award ceremony to receive the award in person. Local clubs should verify with their candidate that he or she would be able to be present at both the District and National conventions, if required, before submitting the entry. (PLEASE CONTACT YOY CHAIRPERSON IF THERE IS A CONFLICT)

Accommodations and meals for the winner and parents/guardians at the convention will be provided by the District. Travel will be the responsibility of the sponsoring club.

Accepting the Challenge of Excellence Award A.C.E.

For Year 2023 - 2024

The A.C.E. award is a National Exchange Club program that recognizes high school students who have made dramatic changes in their attitude and performance some time during their high school years and are now eligible for high school graduation. These "at risk" students have often overcome great physical, emotional, or social obstacles, yet few receive recognition.

This is a positive program with two key objectives. First, it helps encourage students to overcome their hardships and get back on track toward a high school diploma. Second, the award recognizes students who are often overlooked for their accomplishments. This special recognition serves as a powerful example to all students that hard work and perseverance really do pay.

The Tennessee District A.C.E. winner is chosen from entries submitted by local Exchange Clubs. The District A.C.E. winner will be presented the award and a scholar-ship of **at least \$1,000** at the District convention. The District winner will also be eligible to compete for the National Exchange Club A.C.E. award.

To be eligible for the District award, the recipient must be present at the District convention to accept the award in person. Local clubs should verify with their nominee that he or she would be able to attend the District convention and, if required, the National convention before submitting the entry. (PLEASE CONTACT YOUTH AWARDS CHAIRPERSON IF THERE IS A CONFLICT). Accommodations and meals at the convention for the award winner and the parents/guardians will be provided by the District. Travel to the convention is the responsibility of the sponsoring club.

During the opening session of the District convention, registration will close for a short period for a roll call of those in attendance.

To determine the winner of the Attendance Award, the number of members from each club present at roll call will be divided by the number of members of the club on May 31st, and then multiplied by the number of miles from the club's home city to the convention site (for clubs in whose home city the convention is held, this number will be 1). The club with the highest point total will receive the Attendance Award.

The E.W. Sprague Award is given annually to the Exchange Club in the Tennessee District that is judged to have had the greatest impact on its community through its programs of service.

Requirements

1. Receive The National Service Award.

In order to achieve this, a club must report to National electronically the required information to show:

- 1. Completion of an Americanism project.
- 2. Completion of a Community Service project.
- 3. Participate in a local or National Foundation Child Abuse Prevention project.
- 4. Completion of a Youth project.
- 5. and completion of any two (2) additional projects (in any category).

A copy of the POS (Program of Service) log (available on the NEC website) must accompany the entry form.

To recap: The reported completion of items 1-4 plus any two additional reported projects will result in the club receiving the **National Service Award** for the club year.

- **2. Membership -** 5 points will be added for each net membership gain (July 1 May 31 of the club year).
- 3. New club building: 20 points will be awarded for each new Traditional Club chartered during the award year.
- **4.** Club Publicity: 5 points will be awarded if the club publishes a bulletin at least once a month or maintains information on club website or official social media site.
- 5. **District Conferences:** 5 points each will be awarded for each club member in attendance.
- **6. District convention (previous year):** 5 points will be awarded for each club member in attendance at roll call.
- 7. Inter-club activities: 5 points will be awarded for the completion of each qualifying inter-club activity. Examples of activities are" participating in "Traveling Gavel" program, co-sponsorship of a service project, co-sponsorship of an inter-club social, or co-sponsorship of a fund raiser.

Deadline for entry:

The signed entry form must be submitted at District convention registration prior to roll call. Any entry not received by roll call will not be eligible.

THE DISTRICT YOUTH OF THE YEAR AWARD OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM

INSTRUCTIONS

The entry form is divided into five parts: Sections 1 and 2 address the candidate's achievements during five of his/her final six semesters in high school (this information is normally obtained from school records); Sections 3 and 4 are to be prepared by the candidate; and, Section 5 must be filled out in its entirety.

All grading should be based on a five semester period beginning with the sophomore (10th grade) year and ending with the close of the first semester of the senior (12th grade) year. Be sure to enter a score for each semester in each appropriate activity column, as well as a total.

Section 1a — Activities

Student Government/Class Government - Report on highest office held per group each semester.

Newspaper/Annual School Publication - Report on highest position held per publication each semester.

Musical Organization - "Band" denotes any musical group which is school-sponsored. "Choir" denotes any vocal group which is school-sponsored. "Orchestra" denotes a formal, symphonic musical organization which is school-sponsored, but not included in band activities. "Drum Major/ Majorette" must be part of school-sponsored activity.

Debate Activities - "Winner" denotes any recognized award achieved as an individual, or as a member of a team, in either an inter- or intra-school competition. However, only one such victory may be counted per semester. "Team" denotes any group representing either a high school class or the high school as a whole. If the candidate receives a score as a winner and is part of a team, he/she should also receive credit for team membership.

Stage Production - "Performer" denotes active participation on stage as a member of a theatrical or similar school-sponsored production. "Production Crew" denotes participation in an activity necessary to support a school performance (i.e. stage hand, projectionist, makeup, etc.). Only one performance may be counted per semester.

Athletic Teams, Club Membership - See explanation on entry form.

Section 1b — Community Service Activities

Community Organization Membership and Volunteer Service Hours - See explanation on entry form.

Section 2 - Grades

Grade point average is for semester period beginning with the sophomore (10th grade) year and ending with the close of the first semester of the senior (12th grade) year. Multiply the student's G.P.A. (using the 4.0 system) by 50 to get the score for Section 2. G.P.A. may not exceed 4.0.

Section 3 — Special Achievements/Awards

List 10 special achievements and awards, specifying if local, state, or national. Attach a typewritten paragraph describing most outstanding achievement. This section, which can be awarded up to a maximum of 160 points, will be scored by the national judges.

Section 4 — Essay

Follow instructions as indicated on form. The subject of the essay will be announced by a letter from The National Exchange Club. The essay will be scored by the team of national judges, which can award the essay as many as 300 points. The essay should be attached to this form as indicated.

Section 5 — Certification/Information Form

Fill out as indicated. Advise candidate that he/she may be contacted by a representative of The National Exchange Club to obtain additional information for publicity purposes.

Accepting the Challenge of Excellence Award - A.C.E.



THE DISTRICT A.C.E. AWARD OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM

PURPOSE

The A.C.E. (Accepting the Challenge of Excellence) Award recognizes high school students who have had to overcome great physical, emotional, or social obstacles and are now eligible for high school graduation.

This is a positive program with two key objectives: it helps encourage students to overcome their hardships and get back on track toward a high school diploma; and it recognizes those students who are often overlooked for their accomplishments. This special recognition serves as a powerful example to all students that hard work and perseverance are rewarded.

The submission deadline for the National A.C.E. Award is June 1. The winner will be presented the A.C.E. Award and a \$15,000 scholarship at Exchange's National Convention. Travel accommodations will be provided to the winner and his/her parents/guardians.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Contact your local high school for a potential candidate for the award. A partial list of difficulties to overcome could include physical, language, child abuse, delinquency, and/or substance abuse.
- 2. Ensure the candidate will graduate from high school this year, <u>OR</u> complete GED classes by the age of 19, by the time of submission of application to National Headquarters (June 1).
- 3. Obtain school official and parent/guardian signatures.
- 4. Recognize the selected individual at an appropriate club meeting.
- 5. If you plan to enter your candidate in the district competition, be sure the A.C.E. Award chairperson has the description narrative (500 words maximum) and the candidate's two brief narratives (250 words maximum) before the deadline.
- 6. The district may use the same judging procedure as National Headquarters or determine its own selection process.
- 7. The district may select one or two (if opposite gender) candidates to submit to National Headquarters by June 1. Advise candidate that he/she may be contacted by a representative of The National Exchange Club to obtain additional information for publicity purposes.
