All clubs must follow the time frame and rules to be considered for awards.

Awards criteria that include impact of club's presence in the community should include, but not be limited to media coverage, thank you notes, members asking to join, additional assistance for projects, and partnerships.

All clubs should be sure that any individual submitted for an award will be able to attend the District Convention before submission to the awards chair.

If any due date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, then the following business day will be acceptable.

## **District Pin Competition**

## For Year 2024 - 2025

Each year, Tennessee Exchangites who attend the District Convention are seen wearing the official Tennessee District lapel pin. The design of this pin is chosen by the Board of Directors through an annual competition.

- Members should submit proposed designs by **Jan. 15th** to the Tennessee District Treasurer.
- The pin design should be capable of reproduction on cloisonné enamel and should include the Exchange logo. Colors are left to the discretion of the designer, but the Exchange emblem should be in the official colors of blue, gold, and white.
- The size of the pin may vary but should not exceed 2 inches in width or 2 inches in height. Remember that the pin is intended to be worn on the lapel, so larger sizes may not be appropriate.

## Pat Chrostowski Bulletin Award

## For Year 2024 - 2025

## **Entry Form**

There will be three Pat Chrostowski Bulletin Awards presented each year

- one for large clubs (those with 75 or more members)
- one for mid clubs (those with 30–74 members)
- one for small clubs (29 or fewer members)

Membership size is determined based on July 1st of the fiscal year. Criteria for this award are based on the following:

- To be eligible, a club must publish at least one bulletin per month.
- This form must be accompanied by at least three and not more than six issues of the bulletin.
- Bulletins will be rated on a scale of 1 to 10, with 10 being the highest score.
- Bulletins will be judged on content, readability, eye appeal, club news coverage, and Exchange education (refer to attached rating sheet). These criteria are those established by the National Exchange Club for its national bulletin competition.
- Hardcopy and electronically submitted bulletins will each be judged on their individual and unique qualities – hardcopies judged in print form, and electronically submitted judged electronically.
- To be eligible, all entries must be submitted to the district awards chairperson by March 1st.

## Pat Chrostowski Bulletin Award Criteria

## For Year 2024 - 2025

## Content

Maximum points: 30
A. Is content balanced between news of upcoming meeting programs, other club events, project progress, reports of recent projects, member news, items of general Exchange interest, personality profiles, humor?
B. Does the bulletin promote participation, attendance, membership, and new club building, Exchange education, and significant news on district and national levels of Exchange?
C. Does the bulletin carry the correct Exchange Club logo as well as the complete and correct club name, city, state, date, meeting time, and place? Score
Readability
Maximum points: 10
Does the writing meet acceptable standards of punctuation, sentence structure, grammar, and spelling Is writing concise, understandable, and accurate?
Eye Appeal
Maximum points: 10
Does the overall appearance of the bulletin stimulate readership? Are the masthead and other elements creatively and neatly handled with occasional artwork, photos, color, etc.?  Does the layout incorporate careful attention to white space, page balance, and the importance and organization of the articles?

### **National Best Club Bulletin Award**

## For Year 2024 - 2025

A plaque will be awarded to three club bulletin editors—one for large clubs with more than 75+ members, one for mid clubs with 30-74 members and one for fewer than 29 members.

The objectives of the National Best Club Bulletin Award are:

- To recognize and encourage excellence among Exchange Clubs in the publication of local Exchange Club bulletins.
- To impress upon club leaders the value to the members and to the success of the club itself of publishing readable, attractive, and informative bulletins on a regular basis.
- To stimulate through the bulletin greater club unity, attendance at meetings, membership participation, involvement, enthusiasm, and awareness of Exchange goals, principles, and ideals.
- To encourage the publication of club bulletins by Exchange Clubs that do not currently do so.

#### Requirements:

- 1. Bulletin must be published and distributed at least once a month.
- 2. Winners of the award become ineligible for the next year's competition.
- 3. Deadline for receipt of entries at National Headquarters is April 10.
- 4. Bulletins will be judged for content, readability, and eye appeal. The bulletin in each membership category with the highest score will be the winner.
- 5. Entries will be judged by a panel of professionals with experience in writing, newspaper or periodical editing, or related communications field.
- 6. Please submit no more than three samples of a club's bulletin published between April 1 and March 31 for consideration by the judges.

Application: Send the <u>National Best Club Bulletin Award entry form</u> and three samples published between April 1 and March 31 to National Headquarters.

NOTE: beginning in fiscal year 2008-2009, a Club <u>does not</u> have to win the District Bulletin Award to submit their Club Bulletin for a National Award.

#### Youth of the Year

## For Year 2024 - 2025

Youth of the Year is a National Exchange Club awards program that recognizes outstanding students in the community who have excelled in academics and leadership. When your club becomes involved in this worthwhile program, you are joining hundreds of other clubs across the country in an effort to identify and recognize the youth leaders of the nation.

Local Exchange Club Youth of the Year winners are eligible to compete for the Tennessee District Youth of the Year award. The TN District award carries a scholarship of at least \$1,000 and the right to compete for the National Exchange Club Youth of the Year award.

The Tennessee District Youth of the Year award will be presented at the TN District convention. To be eligible, the award winner must be present at the award ceremony to receive the award in person. Local clubs should verify with their candidate that he or she would be able to be present at both the District and National conventions, if required, before submitting the entry. (PLEASE CONTACT YOY CHAIRPERSON IF THERE IS A CONFLICT)

Accommodations and meals for the winner and parents/guardians at the convention will be provided by the District. Travel will be the responsibility of the sponsoring club.

#### How to enter:

1. Complete the nomination form, which can be obtained from the District youth chair-person or from the National website, <a href="www.nationalexchangeclub.org">www.nationalexchangeclub.org</a>.

Note: Section 4 – 2024-2025 Youth of the Year Essay Theme is "In a world that is constantly changing and ever-evolving, our youth play critical roles in shaping the future of their communities. From advocating to leading, young people are taking charge and making significant impacts. How have you personally contributed to society and how do you envision your future in community service?"

- 2. Review and complete the District form which is found on the following page. The completed and signed form must accompany the entry packet.
- 3. Make sure school officials, parent/guardian, and sponsoring club president sign the form from National. Club president and club secretary must sign the District form.
- 4. Include a 5x7 photograph of the nominee, *only if requested by Youth Chair*.
- 5. Forward the entry forms, required essay, and photograph to the District youth chairperson by April 15, 2025

# Accepting the Challenge of Excellence Award A.C.E.

## For Year 2024 - 2025

The A.C.E. award is a National Exchange Club program that recognizes high school students who have made dramatic changes in their attitude and performance some time during their high school years and are now eligible for high school graduation. These "at risk" students have often overcome great physical, emotional, or social obstacles, yet few receive recognition.

This is a positive program with two key objectives. First, it helps encourage students to overcome their hardships and get back on track toward a high school diploma. Second, the award recognizes students who are often overlooked for their accomplishments. This special recognition serves as a powerful example to all students that hard work and perseverance really do pay.

The Tennessee District A.C.E. winner is chosen from entries submitted by local Exchange Clubs. The District A.C.E. winner will be presented the award and a scholar-ship of **at least \$1,000** at the District convention. The District winner will also be eligible to compete for the National Exchange Club A.C.E. award.

To be eligible for the District award, the recipient must be present at the District convention to accept the award in person. Local clubs should verify with their nominee that he or she would be able to attend the District convention and, if required, the National convention before submitting the entry. (PLEASE CONTACT YOY CHAIRPERSON IF THERE IS A CONFLICT). Accommodations and meals at the convention for the award winner and the parents/guardians will be provided by the District. Travel to the convention is the responsibility of the sponsoring club.

- 2. Follow instructions on page 2, making sure the club president and secretary sign section 3.

## Fred Harron Attendance Award NEC President 1984-1985

## For Year 2024 - 2025

During the opening session of the District convention, registration will close for a short period for a roll call of those in attendance.

To determine the winner of the Attendance Award, the number of members from each club present at roll call will be divided by the number of members of the club on May 31<sup>st</sup>, and then multiplied by the number of miles from the club's home city to the convention site (for clubs in whose home city the convention is held, this number will be 1). The club with the highest point total will receive the Attendance Award.

To be eligible for the award, a club must be in good standing with both National and District and must have a minimum membership of 15. All clubs in contention for the award must verify the roll call by attesting that those members in attendance are in good standing (dues paid).

The convention secretary's member attendance count at roll call will be the sole determinant of the number of members present from each club. Members registered at the convention but not present and answering at roll call will not be counted in the club's total for award purposes.

## E.W. Sprague Award NEC President 1937-1938

#### For Year 2024 - 2025

The E.W. Sprague Award is given annually to the Exchange Club in the Tennessee District that is judged to have had the greatest impact on its community through its programs of service.

## Requirements

#### **Section 1:**

In order to be eligible for the E.W. Sprague Award, a club must meet the following minimum standards:

- 1. Complete an Americanism project.
- 2. Complete a Community Service project.
- 3. Participate in a local or National Foundation Child Abuse Prevention project.
- 4. Complete a Youth project.
- 5. Complete a Fund-Raising project.

**Note**: The reported completion of items 1-4 plus any two additional reported projects will result in the club also receiving the National Service Award for the club year.

#### **Section 2:**

The club must complete the attached **entry form** and submit a **club scrapbook**. The scrapbook should include pictures, newspaper articles, club bulletins, etc. that support the projects your club has completed. All projects listed on the Sprague Award entry form must include the page number in the **scrapbook** so that the project may be documented.

## **Scoring**

#### 1. National service requirements, maximum 100 points:

20 points per project will be awarded for completion of projects in Section 1. In the event a club completes a project required under Section 1 multiple times, the first completion will be awarded 20 points and each subsequent completion will be listed in Section 3 as a Local Service Projects and additional occurrences of projects.

#### 2. Other National service projects:

10 points will be awarded for the first completion of each of the other National program of service projects as described in the Leadership Manual. In the event a club completes a project required under Section 2 multiple times, the first — completion will be awarded 10 points and each subsequent completion will be listed in Section 3 as a Local Service Projects and additional occurrences of projects.

#### 3. Local service projects:

**5** points will be awarded to small clubs (fewer than 29 members as of July 1<sup>st</sup>) for completion of any local program that meets a community need or Child Abuse Prevention project and is identified by the public as an Exchange Club activity.

**3** points will be awarded to mid-size clubs (30-74 members as of July 1<sup>st</sup>) and large size clubs (75+ members) as of July 1<sup>st</sup>) for completion of any local program that meets a community need or Child Abuse Prevention project and is identified by the public as an Exchange Club activity.

#### 4. Fund-raising activities:

10 points will be awarded for each funding raising activity not listed in Section 1.

#### 5. Membership:

5 points will be added for each net membership gain.

#### 6. New club building:

20 points will be awarded for each new Traditional club, Excel or Collegiate Club chartered during the award year.

#### 7. Club Publicity:

10 points will be awarded if the club publishes a bulletin at least once a month or maintains information on club website or official social media site.

#### **8. District Conferences:**

5 points each will be awarded for each club member in attendance.

#### 9. District convention (previous year):

5 points will be awarded for each club member in attendance at roll call.

#### 10. Inter-club activities:

10 points will be awarded for the completion of each qualifying inter-club activity. Examples of qualifying activities are" participating in "Traveling Gavel" program, co-sponsorship of a service project, co-sponsorship of an inter-club social, or co-sponsorship of a fund raiser.

#### **Deadline for entry:**

Both the entry form and the club scrapbook must be submitted at District convention registration prior to roll call. **Any entry not received by roll call will not be eligible.**

#### **Examples of proper and improper scoring:**

- Example A: The Exchange Club of Rocky Top presents a Blue & Gold Award. It is decided to list the Blue & Gold as the club's "Community Service" project in *Section 1 as a National Program (20 points)*.
  - Therefore, the same Blue & Gold Award may NOT be entered in *Section 2 as Other National Programs of Service (10 points)*.
  - However, if <u>two</u> different Blue & Gold Awards were presented as <u>two</u> separate projects on <u>two</u> different dates, the second award would be listed in *Section 3 as Additional Occurrences of Projects already listed in Sections 1 or 2 (5 or 3 points depending on club size).*
- Example B: The Exchange Club of Rocky Top receives permission to hand out American flags at the County Fair. There are 4 entrances to the Fair and 2 Exchangites cover each entrance. This is one (1) project, not four. The project may be entered in *Section 1 as the Americanism project (20 points)*.
  - If listed in Section 1, the project may NOT be listed as GIVEAKIDAFLAGTO -WAVE in Section 2 as Other National Programs of Service (10 points).
  - If the same project is repeated at a different location and date, it may be listed in Section 3 as Additional Occurrences of Projects listed in sections 1 or 2 (5 or 3 points depending on club size).
- Example C: The Exchange Club of Rocky Top presents Youth of the Year scholarships at their annual YOY Banquet. It is decided to list the YOY Banquet as the club's "Youth" project in Section 1 as a National Program (20 points).
  - Therefore, the same YOY Banquet may NOT be entered in *Section 2 as Other National Programs of Service (10 points)*, even though there were <u>four scholarships presented at the same YOY Banquet</u>.
  - However, if <u>four</u> different YOY Scholarships were presented at <u>four</u> separate YOY Banquets on <u>four</u> different dates, the second, third, and fourth scholarship would be listed in *Section 3 as Additional Occurrences of Projects already listed in Sections 1 or 2 (5 or 3 points depending on club size).*
- Example D: A "speaker" without member training or action is not a project of service.
- Example E: A donation without member involvement is not a project of service.
